South Lebanon Fire Department Merger

The three volunteer fire companies in South Lebanon Township (South Lebanon Fire Company #1 (formerly Hebron Hose and Citizens of Avon), Prescott Community Fire Company and Friendship Fire Company of South Lebanon Township) recently voted to submit to the state a plan of merger, forming one volunteer company with three locations. **The merged company would be known as the South Lebanon Fire Department.** Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of South Lebanon Township, Steve Krause, commented on the upcoming merger with a request to residents:

“I’m proud of the efforts by our volunteers, municipal management and elected officials that have worked tirelessly to plan and execute this merger. The forward thinking and cooperation of all those involved will provide for excellent emergency response for public safety in our community long into the future. But if we are to succeed, we still need to have volunteers to serve in all capacities within the fire department. Age/Gender/Race are not limiting factors. We need help in every capacity - whether someone serves as a fire fighter, apparatus operator, or committee/board member. Without volunteers, who will answer the call?”

WELL WATER STUDY

Researchers at Temple University are **looking for families who drink water from a private well for a paid study**. They are interested in keeping children safe from illnesses that can be spread by drinking water from private wells. **Families will receive a free whole-home UV water treatment system (value of device + installation = \$1,000)**. Families can participate from home. **To be part of this NIH-funded study, families must have a child three years old or younger and live in select Pennsylvania counties.**

- **Birdbaths** — Change water frequently.
- **Tires** — Drill holes in tire to allow water to drain.
- **Pool Covers** — Make sure water isn't gathering on top.
- **Flower Pots** — Remove stagnant water from pots.
- **Pet Bowls** — Switch out pet bowls with fresh water often.

Feeding Outdoor Cats is Discouraged

- You must take responsibility for the cats that are fed by you. They are now your pets.
- You must **get them spayed or neutered** to keep the cat population at a minimum and prevent them from roaming on neighbors property.

Problems Created By Feeding Outdoor Cats

- Cats will overpopulate residential neighborhoods.
- Cats will defecate and spray on your neighbors property, creating a nuisance.
- Keeping food outdoors will attract other outdoor animals, such as skunks, possums and raccoons.

What is the Township Doing to Resolve the Problem

- Participation in “The Nobody’s Cats Foundation” — TNR Program
- Township will issue vouchers to residents to take the cat(s) to the Camp Hill location to be spayed or neutered.

- Lebanon County Humane Society will usually accept young kittens.

Sewer Bills

South Lebanon Township sewer bills are due in: **March, June, September and December.** **PINK bills due the 5th, GREEN bills due the 15th, and BLUE bills due the 25th.** If a due date falls on a holiday or weekend, then the due date will be the next available business day.

Payments can be made via **cash, check or money order** in the office; placed in the Township drop box; or mailed to **1800 South 5th Avenue, Lebanon, PA 17042.** If you choose to mail your payment, allow plenty of time for the mail to arrive at the Township. **Payments must be received by 4:00 pm on the due date to be considered “on time”.**

You can also make online payments by going to www.twp.south-lebanon.pa.us and following the “Pay Sewer Bill Online” link. **A fee will be charged for all online payments.**

Reminder—If you’re connected to public water you will also receive a separate quarterly bill from the City of Lebanon Authority for your **water consumption.** **This is different from your sewer bill.**

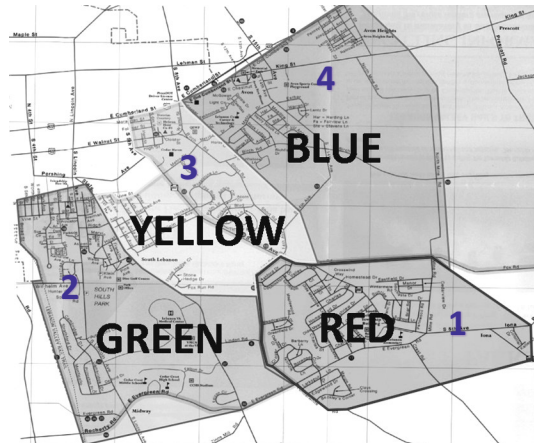

Spring Curbside Yard Waste Collection Guidance

WHEN: Begins **Monday April 17** (weather permitting)



Items at Curb



First Crew



Second Crew

ONLY ONCE PER NEIGHBORHOOD!! The first crew will come around once to pick up the large pieces and then the second crew will come through to sweep up small debris left behind. **Crews will not return if they've already been through your neighborhood.**

Don't wait until April 17th to put out your yard waste!!!! Combine piles with neighbors when possible!

WHAT: Garden plants, hedge trimmings, tree branches less than 5" diameter, leaves **NO GRASS CLIPPINGS** nor anything that would damage the equipment!! Limit your pile to about the amount that would fit in a pickup truck bed. **It is the resident's responsibility to dispose of any unacceptable items or piles.**

WHAT NOT TO DO:

- × Place piles close to vehicles or large obstructions!
- × Leave piles on yard or sidewalk!
- × Include trash or other items in pile!

DO THIS INSTEAD:

- ✓ Move vehicle or place pile away from large obstructions!
- ✓ Place pile at curb or on street a week before pick up!
- ✓ Remove all trash, tarps, bags, decorations, etc. from pile!

South Lebanon Township residents can purchase a Yard Waste & Recycling Center permit for \$40/year. To obtain a permit, **bring a photo ID and payment (cash, check or money order) to the Township Building.**

TIRE RECYCLING

Lebanon Tire Collection will be held at the **Lebanon Expo Center** from **8 a.m. to 4 p.m.** on **Wednesday, April 26, 2023** for all Lebanon County Residents. **10 auto or 1 oversized tires can be collected for free**, so long as funds are available. Excess tires or tires after Township funds are all used, will be accepted at \$4 per auto tire and \$40 per oversized tire (over 25 inches). **Pre-register from February 25th through April 14th by calling 717-277-5275 .**

FREE MULCH DAY

On **Saturday, April 22, 2023**, South Lebanon Township will be hosting a **FREE MULCH DAY** to community members and residents from **9:00 a.m. until noon** at the Yard Waste and Recycling Center located at **3 Linden Road**.

There will be staff available on-site to help load mulch during this event. *Mulch is made from yard trimmings collected at the Recycling Center and during curbside collection.*

Permit holders can load their own mulch any time during operating hours, 7 days a week.

ARBOR DAY EVENT

The Lebanon County Clean Water Alliance will be holding an **Arbor Day Event at South Hills Park on Friday, April 28, 2023.** Please follow the website for updates, including the official time of the event.

This event is open to the public. There will be a presentation by the Lebanon Valley Conservancy, vendor tables and food trucks.

Preventing Stormwater Runoff Pollution

- ◆ Only allow rain water to enter storm drains and inlets.
- ◆ **No leaves, no grass, no trash.**
- ◆ **Never dump anything into storm drains or streams.**
- ◆ **It is illegal to allow grass clippings in the street.**
- ◆ Pick up after your pet.
- ◆ Use least-toxic fertilizers and pesticides.
- ◆ Check your car for leaks and recycle your oil.
- ◆ **Wash your vehicles at a local car wash instead of in your driveway.** This will help keep harmful detergents and soaps out of the streams.

Residential and Commercial Recycling

Trash and Recycling collection is **not provided by the township**. It is up to each **residential** unit to contract with a local hauler for these services. *Some haulers collect more items than we require in our ordinance, so check with your hauler to be sure you are making the most of the recycling program.*

Commercial, industrial and municipal establishments must recycle office paper and corrugated cardboard as well as the items mandated for residential.

South Lebanon Township's Yard Waste and Recycling Center located at 3 Linden Road has drop off bins available for residential and commercial establishments to recycle corrugated cardboard, mixed paper, aluminum cans and bi-metal cans. Please do your part to improve recycling in our community, by placing only recyclable materials in the bin. Remember...

WHEN IN DOUBT, THROW IT OUT!

Battery Recycling

Greater Lebanon Refuse Authority (GLRA) has been approved as a **Call2Recycle** collection site. Now residents can **recycle all rechargeable and single use batteries** for **FREE** at GLRA's new **Electronics Recycling Facility**, located at 1805 Russell Road. *Can't make it to the Electronics Recycling Facility? Bring your batteries to the Township Building located at 1800 South 5th Avenue and we will take them for you.*

Each individual battery must be under 11 pounds and **placed individually in a clear plastic storage / Ziploc bag**. Bags are available at the E-Waste Facility. Batteries may hold a residual charge even when they appear dead. When a battery comes into contact with other batteries or metal, a spark or heat can occur and cause a fire or explosion. Bagging the batteries individually is the quickest and easiest way to protect battery terminals. **ONE BATTERY PER BAG!** There is a **LIMIT OF 50 BATTERIES PER VISIT PER CUSTOMER**. RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR RESIDENTS



- Township Ordinance prohibits making disturbing noises between 11 pm—7 am.
- Vehicle repair & maintenance is not permitted on any street, road or alley.
- Vehicles without valid registration and inspection shall not be parked or stored on any street or property except for a completely enclosed building or approved junk yard.
- Ordinance 324 allows for the use of recreational burn pits that are 15 feet from any building, property line, and road line. Burning of leaves, paper, refuse or other material or substance of any kind, including, without limitation, any recyclable materials is PROHIBITED as defined by the PA DEP.



Grass Clippings

- ♦ It is illegal to allow grass clippings to remain on the street. **Gather clippings and mulch them** or place them in the trash.
- ♦ Obtain **permission from the owner before** piling grass clippings or yard waste in a field or wooded area
- ♦ **Per Ordinance 330 — Weeds and grass are not to exceed six (6) inches in height.**

Per Ordinance 278, article 16 — Temporary signs & advertisements (*i.e. yard sale, lawn care, etc.*) are prohibited along roadways and on poles in South Lebanon Township.



Permanent signs require a permit from Lebanon County Planning at 717-228-4444.

FIREWORKS in residential areas

- ◆ They are legal in residential areas; however, **you must be 18 years of age to use.**
- ◆ They cannot be ignited or discharged on a public or private property without express permission of the property owner.
- ◆ **YOU MUST BE AT LEAST 150 FEET FROM ANY OCCUPIED STRUCTURE.**
Please note: 150 feet is 50 yards or half the length of a football field (from 50 yard line to the end zone)
- ◆ Fireworks may NOT be thrown out of, or from a moving vehicle.



- ◆ You may NOT be under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance while handling fireworks.
- If you are found to be in violation of the PA Fireworks Law, it is a punishable offense. **If you wish to report offenders you must do so while the offense is occurring by calling 717-272-2054. Do not send a complaint form or leave a message on the administrative office voicemail or report it online.***

FOG refers to Fats, Oils, and Grease from food preparation and kitchen clean up. Significant sources of FOG include: Meat Fats; Cooking Fats; Food Scraps; Sauces; salad dressings and mayonnaise; and dairy products—Lard & butter.



- ✓ **DO:** Pour cooking oil into covered containers and dispose with garbage
- ✓ **DO:** Scrape food scraps into the garbage or compost bin
- ✓ **DO:** Wipe dishes free of FOG

- X **DON'T:** Discharge FOG down drains, sinks, or storm grates
- X **DON'T:** Scrape food scraps into the sink
- X **DON'T:** Run water over greasy dishes
