

MINUTES

South Lebanon Township

April 14, 2026

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1. The meeting of the South Lebanon Township Board of Supervisors was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chairman Stephen Krause, with Vice Chairman Jonathan Beers, Supervisor Jeffrey Chernich, Township Manager Jamie Yiengst, Assistant Manager Douglas Bishop, Police Chief Ken Zimmerman, Fire Police Captain Justin Hinkle, two (2) visitors and one (1) news reporter present.
2. Chairman Krause led the group in saluting the flag.
3. VISITORS:
 - A. Brianna Laliberte, Emergency Management Coordinator, was present to give an update of recent activities and plans for 2026.
 - B. Jim Sak, 16 Edward Avenue, was present to observe the meeting.
4. MINUTES:
 - A. The Minutes of the meeting held on March 24, 2026, were read and approved on motion by Chernich, seconded by Beers. Motion passed unanimously.
5. REPORTS:
 - A. The Police Monthly Activity and Total Calls Reports for the month of March, were reviewed and accepted on motion by Chernich, seconded by Beers. Motion passed unanimously.
 - B. The Police Work Schedule for the month of May was approved on motion by Chernich, seconded by Beers. Motion passed unanimously.
 - C. The Public Works Report for the month of March was read and accepted on motion by Chernich, seconded by Beers. Motion passed unanimously.
 - D. The Board was given copies of the General Fund Income Statements ending March 31, 2026.
 - E. The District Justice Report for the month of March, indicating traffic fines of \$6,230.08 and non-traffic fines of \$99.49, for a total of \$6,329.57 collected, was accepted on motion by Chernich, seconded by Beers. Motion passed unanimously.
6. COMMUNICATIONS:
 - A. The Board read a letter from the Womelsdorf Mennonite Church Youth Group requesting permission to hold a 5K run at South Hills Park on May 16, 2026. Permission was granted on motion by Chernich, seconded by Beers. Motion passed unanimously.
 - B. The Board read a letter from Cornwall United Methodist Church requesting permission to hold Vacation Bible School at the Orchard Pavilion of South Hills Park on Wednesday evenings in July. Permission was granted on motion by Chernich, seconded by Beers. Motion passed unanimously.
 - C. The Board read a request from the Cedar Crest Class of 2026 requesting permission to hold a Senior Day at South Hills Park on June 1, 2026. Permission was granted on motion by Chernich, seconded by Beers. Motion passed unanimously.
7. OLD BUSINESS: None
8. NEW BUSINESS:
 - A. The Board held discussion on the option of joining the South Lebanon Township Police Department with the Lebanon County Regional Police Department. On motion by Chernich, seconded by Beers, the

Supervisors declined the option as they are please with the current coverage. Motion passed unanimously.

- B. The Board approved a Drug Task Force Member Agreement with Lebanon County and authorized the Chief of Police to sign, on motion by Chernich, seconded by Beers. Motion passed unanimously.
 - C. Colin Krow was offered conditional employment as a seasonal part-time South Hills Park employee, with the following stipulation, on motion by Chernich, seconded by Beers. Motion passed unanimously.
 - 1. PA Child Abuse History Clearance, PA State Police Criminal Record Check and FBI Criminal Background Check to be free from any offenses listed in the Child Protective Services Law.
 - D. Resolution #1553, Intermunicipal Agreement with Richland Borough for use of South Lebanon Township's Yard Waste and Recycling Center, was adopted on motion by Chernich, seconded by Beers. Motion passed unanimously.
9. Bills amounting to \$298,627.95 were individually examined and approved for payment on motion by Chernich, seconded by Beers. Motion passed unanimously.
10. The meeting was adjourned at 7:28 p.m. by Chairman Krause.
